

Iwi Statistics

The following table is a helpful guide for planners and researchers who may be interested in iwi statistics. It provides links to where you will find this data – so if you are interested in iwi statistics, follow the links in the table below.

Government agencies such as Statistics New Zealand, the Ministry of Education and the Department of Labour collect iwi statistics. Some of them publish this data – others make their data available on request (some at cost).

If you have any questions about the statistics or how to get other iwi data, *make sure to contact the agencies responsible.*

Statistics New Zealand is only able to provide profiles on some Affiliated iwi.
